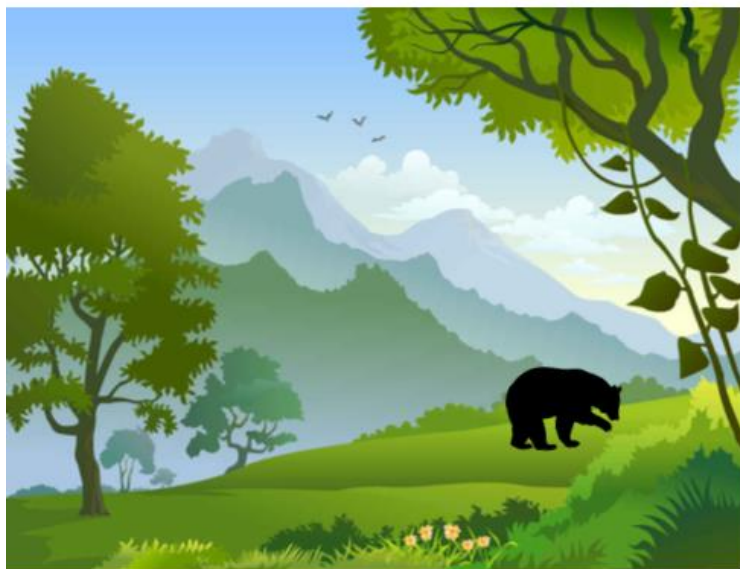

MISSION, OUTREACH & EVANGELISM

Whether local, regional, or abroad...whether giving or serving, we reach out to those in need. The Mission, Outreach, & Evangelism (MOE) Team are the hands and feet of Christ at Cashiers United Methodist Church. There are many opportunities and ways to get involved to help others and show your care:

- **Fishes & Loaves Food Pantry** - Help distribute food boxes at the Pantry during November, and/or give financially to our special offering in November. Help with the Mountain Breakfast and Soup Bowl fundraisers.
 - **UMCOR** - Support United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), who are like first responders for the UMC in times of disasters with financial support and items provided for flood and hygiene buckets.
 - **BRS (Blue Ridge School) & C4C (Churches for Children)** - Volunteer at BRS by opening car doors at drop-off, tutoring, gardening, or other support.
 - **Angel Tree** - "Adopt" a needy child at Christmas to provide gifts of toys and clothing.
 - **International Interns** - Volunteer with us to partner with High Hampton to provide fellowship opportunities for the summer International Interns. Volunteers are always appreciated.
 - **ELL (English Language Learners)** - In partnership with Church of the Good Shepherd, volunteer on Monday evenings during the school year to help with meals (serving and clean-up), assist in the children's program, or help in the ELL classes.
 - **Christmas and Easter Books** - Help distribute books to preschoolers in the Cashiers area at Easter and Christmas to teach them about Jesus and his love.
 - **Local Mission Fix-It Team** - Help local residents with simple repairs to their home and yard.
 - **Mission Teams** - Travel with a team as needed to help with rebuilding from natural disasters.
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- **Special Mission Projects** - Help as needed with special projects such as Haiti Wells & Heifer International and other local projects.
 - **Medical Lending Closet** - We have gently used medical equipment that we loan out to residents and visitors. Help is needed to keep the closet organized and cleaned out.
 - **Meals on Wheels** - Help deliver pre-made lunches to area shut-ins through the Jackson County Meals on Wheels program.
 - **Missionaries** - We support, with our money and prayers:

Postsecondary Scholarship - CUMC gives one-time, limited scholarships to deserving local students who are graduating from high school and will be attending a two or four-year college or university, trade or vocational school. The application process is in February and March and selections are made in April.

Mother's Morning Out (MMO) Scholarships - Occasionally, we have children who can be well-served by attending our preschool-age program who need assistance to send their child here. We offer partial scholarships to help these families as they see growth in all areas of development when their child attends.

CHILDREN, YOUTH & FAMILIES

Our CYF team works to make sure that our children, youth, and families are nurtured in their faith development through programs, service, and fellowship. **Volunteers are always needed!**

- **Kreative Kidz Zone** - Our Wednesday after-school program for children K-5th grade where they grow in their faith through programs that offer a full palette of creative activities with the arts and God; this includes vocal and instrumental music, Revelatory Contemporary dance, Healthy HeArts, Art of Flight, Art of Architecture, Puppetry, Visual Arts, Gardening, and more.
 - **KKZ Chorus** - During our weekly KKZ program, children participate in the chorus where they learn about music and will prepare and present a musical at Christmas and in the spring.
 - **Godly Play** - Our Sunday morning Children's Church program for children ages 3 and up during the 10:30 a.m. service. The interactive lessons invite the children to enter into the stories and relate them to their personal experience.
 - **Summer Arts Camp** - Our week-long camp for rising Kindergarten - 5th graders. They spend the week exploring the wonders of music and instruments, while working on a musical that they perform at the end of the week.
 - **Nursery** - A nursery is provided for little ones too young to attend Godly Play. Pagers are provided to parents in the event they are needed during the service.
 - **Youth Group** - Is a program for our 4th - 8th graders on Sunday evenings from 5 - 7 p.m. where they grow in their faith through devotions, service opportunities, and fellowship.
 - **Confirmation** - For youth in 5th grade and up who are ready to take the next step in their commitment to Christ and the Church through this special milestone of confirming their baptism and becoming full members of the church.
 - **Acolytes** - A child in 2nd grade and above can serve as an acolyte in the worship service. His/her responsibility is to light the Christ Candle at the beginning of the service and extinguish it at the end of the service as he/she takes the light into the world.

ADULT MINISTRIES

The Adult Ministries team provides opportunity for spiritual growth, fellowship, and service with other adults through Bible Studies, day trips, fellowship gatherings, and other opportunities.

- **Adult Sunday School** - TruthSeekers Class for couples and singles meets at 9:35 a.m. on Sundays and typically uses the Adult Bible Studies published by Cokesbury.
 - **United Methodist Men** - This group, who meets on the first Tuesday of each month, is open to all men who want to grow in their relationship with Christ through service and fellowship opportunities.
 - **Wednesday Bible Study** - Following our Wednesday Fellowship meal each week, we have a Bible Study where we study various Christian authors, books, and other topics such as Spiritual Gifts and the Trinity.
 - **Women's Monday Bible Study** - Women are invited to attend various short-term Bible Studies on Mondays at 1:00 p.m.
 - **Table of Six** - A way to meet and get to know others in our church family by sharing a few meals together during the summer. Each group of six decides when and where to meet.
 - **Emmaus Walk** - A weekend of spiritual growth and renewal for men and women where their lives are enriched and strengthened.
 - **Special Events** include day trips, hiking excursions, Flat Rock Playhouse performances, concerts at Lake Junaluska and Hendersonville, annual Gardening Seminar with lunch, and more.
 - **Hearts Afire Chili Luncheon** - This church-wide event is on Pentecost Sunday and a great way to celebrate the birth of the church and to welcome back our summer residents.
 - **Summer Season Send-off** - This special Sunday combines homecoming and a time to say goodbye to our summer residents. Adult Ministries teams with Worship for this event.
 - **Good Samaritan Drivers** - Transportation provided for medical appointments and prescription pick-up.
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WORSHIP

The Worship Ministry Team assists the pastor and worship leaders with many aspects of worship. Through their leadership in various roles of this ministry, the team creates beautiful and meaningful worship experiences for all. The following “sub groups” work together to give Glory to God in worship:

- **Altar Guild** - Changes the altar hangings (paraments) as the liturgical seasons change.
 - **Ushers** - Welcome people as they enter the sanctuary; hand out bulletins, take up the offering, chime the bell, record attendance, along with various other tasks.
 - **Music** - *See separate section on next page.*
 - **Coffee in the Commons** - Provides goodies for fellowship time on Sunday mornings in the Commons beginning at 9:20 a.m.
 - **Communion Steward** - Purchases the communion supplies and sets up the altar for communion on the first Sunday of the month and other special services.
 - **Communion Assistants** - Help the pastor administer communion on Communion Sunday.
 - **Audio-Visual Team** - Operates the audio-visual equipment such as sound to the microphones, visuals during the service, and video records the different services. Training is provided.
 - **Flowers** - Oversees the beautiful flowers for Sunday and special worship services.
 - **Acolytes** - Children who assist the pastor in worship by lighting and extinguishing the Christ Candle.
 - **Children’s Worship Clipboards** - Makes sure the children’s worship clipboards are updated weekly.
 - **Special Services** – Assist as needed with Ash Wednesday, Holy Week service, Easter, Christmas, Summer Season Send-off (teamed with Adult Ministries for this service), and Funerals.

MUSIC

All music ministry experiences are open to everyone regardless of skill level. All activities are designed to enrich the musical experiences of our congregation and our community.

- **Adult Choir** – Rehearses on Wednesdays at 7:15 p.m. and Sundays at 9:45 a.m. They sing a wide variety of music including classical anthems, gospel, and contemporary music. The choir leads the music for the 10:30 a.m. Sunday worship service and provides music for special services.
- **Bell Choir** – Rehearses on Mondays at 2:00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. This choir plays once a month for the worship service and plays several concerts a year for the senior citizens. No prior experience necessary.
- **Cashiers Community Chorus (CCC)** – Compiled of people from our community who enjoy singing, this group meets on Thursday evenings (about 6-weeks prior to concert) in our sanctuary to prepare for our community concerts. There are three concerts a year: The *Lenten Cantata* (Palm Sunday), the *Christmas Cantata* (first Sunday of December) - both of these concerts are held in the CUMC sanctuary - and the *Summer/Patriotic Concert* (first Sunday of July) at the Village Green.
- **KKZ Chorus** – The KKZ Chorus is an offshoot of our Kreative Kidz Zone program which is offered on Wednesday afternoons during the school year for K – 5th grade students. Children in the KKZ Chorus learn proper vocal techniques and theory while having a fun experience. The KKZ Chorus participates in the Christmas and Spring productions of the Kreative Kidz Zone.
- **Summer Arts Camp** - A half-day camp in July which provides an opportunity for rising kindergartners—5th graders to learn about music, singing, playing instruments, and more. It's a week filled with lots fun and learning.

- **Summer Piano Concert** – We are honored at CUMC to have Bryan Heller as our accomplished pianist. Every August he offers a wonderful concert with a variety of composers and interesting commentary for each piece. This concert is free and open to the community.
- **Summer Gospel Concert** – A long-standing tradition for our church which is held each year in conjunction with the Summer Season Send-off. This year the concert will take place during our 10:30 a.m. worship service.
- **MMO Music** – Children participating in our Mother's Morning Out preschool program experience fun musical activities geared to introduce them to a love of music. They meet twice a week during the school year.
- **Senior Citizens Center** – Once a month, our music department provides a musical experience at the Senior Citizens Center of Cashiers.

FINANCE

The Finance Committee's purpose is to ensure we are good stewards of the gifts that we have been given through contributions. We oversee the ministry, operational, and administrative budgets to make sure that the mission of CUMC is carried out. We safe-guard the collections and follow approved Policy & Procedures.

We try to provide a variety of ways in which people can give:

- During the worship service with a check or cash—envelopes are available in the pew racks if needed.
- With a check sent through the US Postal Service.
- Through online giving initiated from your personal bank account "Bill Pay," which the church receives in check form.
- Through online debit/credit card giving via 'Joyfully2UMC' app, which is easy to download on your phone. This takes you directly to our online financial service, VANCO.
- Through CUMC's website at www.cashiersumc.org—click on the green "GIVE NOW" icon which takes you to our online giving webpage at VANCO.
- Through gifts of stock and securities initiated by you with your financial advisor - specific information of the process can be found on our website at www.cashiersumc.org/Giving.
- Through Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD), which requires a person who is 70 ½ years or older to make a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRA annually. The IRS allows the tax payer to make this tax-free contribution directly to an eligible charity such as a church.
- By setting your Amazon.com account as a Smile.Amazon account and designating Cashiers United Methodist Church as your charity. We receive a very small percentage of your purchase, and you get to shop and help the church without paying anything additional.
- Another manner in which to give is through **Planned Giving** through your estate.

We encourage seasonal members to consider dividing their annual pledge into 12 payments and giving year around to help with the church operational and mission expenses throughout the year.



TRUSTEES

The Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church provides overarching guidance to the Trustees. *“Trustees function as the Christian stewards of property God has entrusted to the congregation. They have oversight and care of all local church property, buildings, and equipment to further the mission of the church. This work is done in consultation with the Pastor. We annually review property and casualty, liability, and auto insurance coverages.”*

Simply put, the purpose of the Trustees is to support the missions of the Church and provide the facilities and support for our leaders to be successful and achieve their goals to further the Kingdom of God. Just like your home, we have fixed and variable expenses. We negotiate and provide oversight for three contracts for housekeeping, meal host, and landscaping. Church utilities such as gas, water, electricity, and insurance for church property and vehicles is another important aspect of running the church. We are responsible for the condition and care of the church parsonage and work with the pastor and family to make sure they have a good home.

Additionally, we try to improve the property with which we have been entrusted. In past years we have upgraded the audio-visual system; purchased a new paging system for the nursery; installed additional fire, smoke and heat detectors; replaced emergency exit lights; improved parking lot and perimeter lighting; resurfaced the parking lots; conducted van/bus training for our drivers; purchased commercial refrigerator; and are working diligently to correct the Commons roofing and drainage problem, and repair and update the Commons interior area.

TYPES OF MEMBERSHIP

BAPTIZED MEMBER: Although you can be baptized at any age, in the United Methodist Church you are typically baptized as an infant or young child. These baptized members will be instructed and nurtured in the meaning of the faith, the rights and responsibilities of their baptism, and spiritual and moral formation until an age when they can profess their faith and become full members.

ADULT BAPTISM: A person who is baptized as an adult or youth, will profess their faith at that time and become a full member of the church.

FULL MEMBER: A person who has been baptized and who has made a profession of faith in a worship service. A full member has the right to serve on committees and assume various leadership roles within the church.

AFFILIATE MEMBER: A person who is a full member of a United Methodist church in his or her "hometown" but who resides in Cashiers for an extended period of time and wishes to have an affiliation with CUMC. This type of membership entitles the person to the fellowship of our church, to pastoral care, to participation in activities including holding an office, and to vote on official business of CUMC.

ASSOCIATE MEMBER: A person who is a full member of another denomination in his or her "hometown" but who resides in Cashiers for an extended period of time and wishes to have an affiliation with CUMC. This type of membership has the same entitlements as the Affiliate Member except they have no vote.

As a member of CUMC, you have committed to support the church with your prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness.

SUNDAY MORNINGS

Coffee in the Commons is a time of fellowship. It's a drop-in format which begins at 9:20 a.m. and ends at 10:20 a.m.

Adult Sunday School begins at 9:35 and ends at 10:15 a.m.

Sunday Worship is a traditional service at 10:30 a.m.

Nursery is offered during the service for little ones.

Children's Church (*Godly Play*), a hands-on Bible curriculum for children 3 years of age and up, is provided during the worship service. The children begin in worship with their parents, and during the first hymn, they leave with their leaders to attend Children's Church. The children return to the worship service on the first Sunday of the month for Communion. On the other Sundays, the parents pick their children up from the Godly Play room.
